Dear Colleagues,

Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) – update to exemptions for nonmedical help providers from the policy requirement to provide remote or face-to-face NMH sessions, or a mixture of the two, as the student chooses.

SSIN 07/21 (<u>https://www.practitioners.slc.co.uk/media/1887/ssin-0721-new-arrangements-for-remote-support-202122.pdf</u>) set out the following policy regarding the arrangements for remote and face-to-face needs assessments and non-medical help (NMH) sessions:

- All assessment and outreach centres should be able to provide either remote or face-to-face needs assessments, as the student chooses.
- All NMH providers should be able to provide remote or face-to-face NMH sessions, or a mixture of the two, as the student chooses.

SSIN 09/21 (update-on-arrangements-for-remote-support ssin\_december-2021\_final.pdf (slc.co.uk)) confirmed that DfE had agreed an exemption to this policy for NMH sole traders who have received specific clinical advice from a medical professional not to engage in face-to-face work for reasons relating to Covid-19.

By this SSIN, DfE confirms that any NMH sole trader who has a disability (within the meaning of the Equality Act 2010 and confirmed by a medical professional), which means that they are unable to engage in face-to-face work, may be exempted from the obligation set out in SSIN 07/21. This exemption will mean that a sole trader can be registered as offering remote-only support. Any sole trader who wishes to apply for this exemption should contact the Disabled Students' Allowance team at DfE on
